

14TH ANNUAL CLEAN YOUR STREAMS DAY

September 11, 2010

- 665 Total Participants
- 50 land sites and 1 boat site cleaned
- 22,840 lbs (18,700 lbs garbage + 276 tires)




- \$1.35 Million GLRI grant from US EPA
 - (2 year duration)
- Goals of restoration project
 - Restore/enhance approx. 10 acres wetland & approx 30 acres associated upland habitat
 - Reduce erosion from 1200' of adjacent
 Ottawa River
 - Stream bank restoration of 1200' linear of Ottawa River
 - Increase in-stream habitat for fish and macroinvertebrates




- Increase diversity of in-water habitat for Lake Sawyer, allowing fish to winter over and allowing more active use of Lake Sawyer by Scouts
- Encourage educational use of wetland, lake, river, and upland habitat
- Project contributes to BUI goals and improvements for BUI 14 Loss of Fish and Wildlife Habitat, BUI 3 - Degradation of Fish and Wildlife Habitat




Improve surrounding wetland/upland areas and Ottawa River

Enhance wetlands





Tom Henry



Tom Henry has been a journalist for 29 years and created The Blade's environment beat when he was hired in 1993. He has written about mass murderers, businessmen, some of the nation's top politicians and a bevy of rock 'n' roll stars. He is particularly proud of writing one of the longest, most comprehensive and obsessive articles about the history of pinball ever to appear in a newspaper, not to mention his 1984 first-person story as a hot dog vendor at Detroit's Tiger Stadium.

He began writing a column about the environment for The Blade's Sunday paper in 2007, in addition to his ongoing coverage of that subject. His first major series at The Blade was about the longstanding abuse of Toledo area waterways. Tom has spoken at national conferences



and at major universities about the Great Lakes and energy issues, his two favorite environmental topics. In 2008, he spent 10 days in Greenland researching a four-day series on climate change that was recognized by the Yale Forum on Climate Change & The Media, the Knight Science Journalism Tracker, and Columbia Journalism Review. He was recently elected to the Board of Directors of the Society of Environmental Journalists, one of the nation's largest journalism groups. He has 3 dogs, 2 kids, and a wife. And a cat, too - the coolest cat ever - she's housebroken and does her business outside with the dogs.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Eligibility, Responsibility, Nominations and Voting

ELECTION OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Eligibility

Members of the Board of Directors must be voting members of Partners for Clean Streams. Voting members are defined as individuals donating at least \$50/yr to PCS or businesses/municipalities donating at least \$500/yr to PCS.

Responsibility

Responsibilities of the PCS Board of Directors are as follows, but not limited to: Service of a two year term; Participation in Board meetings every other month, or as called by the President; Maintenance of a voting member status; Assisting the Executive Director in fundraising and program development and implementation; Promote the organization and its efforts; and make overall financial and organization decisions for PCS.

Nominations and Voting

Anyone may nominate someone to serve on the PCS Board of Directors. However, only members with voting status may vote (see above Eligibility) for the PCS Board of Directors.
